

Introduction

The Taranaki Review is a popular and well supported annual exhibition and is the one chance each year that all artists in the Province have of seeing their work on exhibition at the Gallery.

To achieve a better quality exhibition the Director has limited the scope of the exhibition to one art discipline, this year crafts, with everything from ceramics to traditional Maori work represented. This does not mean that painters, sculptors, photographers and printmakers have been precluded. It means only that these people have longer to prepare for their own exhibition in 1981.

It is important to maintain high standards. An exhibition with little quality deters as many people from submitting work as an exhibition that maintains too high a standard discourages amateur enthusiasm. A balance must be achieved and for this reason a limited number of artists/craftspeople - being, Ngaere Adams, potter; Nick Brandon, potter; Howard Tuffery, furniture maker; Tony Kuepfer, glass blower and the Rangimarie Maori Arts and Crafts Group, Maori crafts, have been chosen as guest exhibitors. Their work supplements a review of selected works which have been submitted under open invitation, as has been the procedure in the past.

The Gallery-will be running an extension programme with this exhibition.

- 1. Mr David Clegg a Leadlight craftsman will be demonstrating his techniques and skills from the 29th July to the 15th August. He is setting up his full workshop in the Gallery.
- We will be showing a film on Japanese papermaking centered around Eshiro Abi, the master papermaker who has been declared a 'Living National Treasure'.
- 3. A Weaving demonstration on the vertical loom will also take place although exact dates are not known as yet. These demonstrations will be by the New Plymouth Weavers Guild.
- 4. A Persian Rug display with illustrated knotting techniques and general history along with a collection of carpets will also be exhibited. Three films have been ordered but with the current industrial dispute at the National Film Library there is some doubt as to their arrival.
- Demonstrations of Maori crafts will be given by the members of the Rangimarie Maori Arts and Crafts Group. Exact dates for these have not yet been finalised.

I like using ash plazes and natural ochre earths and enjoy the excitement and tension produced in the pots by high firing to 1300° centigrade and the quietness of firing with burners which do not require forced air." "I think life today is difficult, fewer restrictions have made it too easy to find new directions and ideas from sources that are not always relevant to one's experience. Beginners tend to experiment with too many clays, shapes and glazes, but I find just as much enjoyment and more understanding in the subtle variations of using just one clay, shape or glaze. 'Restrictions being our freedom' it saddens me to find we have no tradition within which to grow. Until such time as we are forced to use only indigenous thoughts and materials a tradition will not be able to grow.

Tradition is like a kiln — a solid form to get to know and within which to work. Solid yet flexible. Use cement in its construction and it will crack, fire it with too much direction and the pots will warp." Nicholas Brandon

emphasise the shape and lines of the piece of furniture.

I use a variety of woods, mostly native and locally grown timbers. All work is oil finished to retain the natural colours within the wood — contrasting the different woods. It is important to continue oiling work finished this way as the oil is absorbed into the wood and a fine durable surface can be retained and improved with repeated oils. My carvings are derived from nature and follow my feeling of wood as being alive, a source for personal learning and growth." Howard Tuffery
