


Made during a burst of intense activity in his final years while living in New York and Puerto Rico, this suite of works captures Lye's pursuit of pre-conscious inspiration. Lye believed in a deep body of unconscious imagery and knowledge known as the 'Old Brain'. This could be accessible when we stop the modern 'New Brain pushing it around'.
